PROJECT ANAGEMENT

Social housing policies are still dramatically underdeveloped in Italy. However, thanks to the activity developed in Lombardy by Fondazione Cariplo starting from 2000, these policies underwent important experimentations, potentially able to influence and steer public

The assignment conducted by KCity, in partnership with IRS (Istituto per la Ricerca Sociale*), and on behalf of Fondazione Cariplo resulted in an important and substantial mapping of the projects funded by the 2000-2013 calls for tender "Spreading and reinforcing temporary social housing". In the first phase, the mapping was made through the definition and the adoption of two survey instruments: a questionnaire (aimed at obtaining quantitative data on the projects), and a survey form for inspections on the premises (aimed at recording qualitative information on properties). In the second phase, qualitative in-depth analysis was conducted to explore four thematic aspects of the most significant temporary social housing projects.

The qualitative data analysis offers a synthetic picture that clarifies the role and position of Fondazione Cariplo and its interlocutors. Possible guidelines were suggested to support temporary social housing actions in the near future. Furthermore, the conducted analysis constitutes a systematic reading tool to rearrange initiatives developed so far and to allow stakeholders to pin down on better investment opportunities, in a learning-by-doing perspective.
